¿Cómo vivir de ahora en adelante? Getting as close as possible to truth From April 29 to May 12, 2022

"At the beginning of winter and at the end of the second wave of Covid in Belgium, I felt the need to start this project. How to rename it all when so much has been blurred? I wrote a letter thinking about some close people, I sent a copy to each one and asked them to respond."

Galería Barrios Bajos, located at Pérez Rosales 968, in Valdivia, Chile, invites you next Friday, April 29th to the launching of the zine "¿Cómo vivir de ahora en adelante? Getting as close as possible to truth". The zine is an independent publication that compiles the exchange of letters between visual artist Paz Ortúzar and 11 women and gender nonconforming people with creative practices from different nationalities (Chile, Poland, Netherlands, USA, Brazil, Greece and Colombia) and all residing in different parts of the world.

With a personal tone, the initial letter poses a series of questions on how to continue living, and from where to situate oneself after the radical changes that have taken place in recent years in Chile and the wider world: which are those alterities? Where are they? Should we invent them? Is there an axis? Do you fantasize about the future? Is there an outside?

The answers are various and diverse, capturing a friendly and honest exchange. They reveal different reflections and intimate feelings about the experience of confinement; the echoes left by the *estallido social* in Chile and the possibility of looking for other life alternatives. The letters include poems, images and emails.

In a collaborative work lasting over more than a year, this micro-edition of 50 publications was published by Hambre Hambre, an independent publishing initiative composed by Daniela Sepúlveda and Camila González.

With the aim of expanding the voices of the participants, the launch of this fanzine is accompanied by an exhibition of their work which includes videos, sculptures, and textiles that will be shown in the gallery's exhibition hall.
